

College Mentor Job Description

As a Coaching4Change (C4C) College Mentor, you will work with a team of peers and professional educators to mentor and support K-12 students enrolled in school at one of our local district partners. C4C has full school-day, half-day, and after-school opportunities available. All C4C placements are supervised, coached, and mentored by a school staff member, while working directly with students.

As a C4C College Mentor, you will:

- Support students in the areas of: academics, social-emotional learning/behavior, and/or attendance
- Build rapport with a consistent group of students to deepen their connection to school
- Lead 1:1 or small group instruction with students
- Support essential parts of the school day such as lunch, recess, or enrichment time
- Work with teachers and other mentors to develop ways to best support students

Requirements:

- Enrolled undergraduate or graduate student in good academic standing
- Positive attitude/growth mindset (willing to reflect, improve, and be coached)
- Preferred to have strong problem-solving skills to improve services day-to-day
- Needs strong interpersonal communication skills (interacting with professionals, peers, families, and students)
